



IN MY WORDS with Hayley Sobey

On July 18th of 2005, at exactly 2:01 in the afternoon, I was born at the East Grampians Health Service to Glenn and Kelly Sobey. As the youngest of three children, I have two older sisters, Gemma, 21 and Tahnee, 19.

From the age of three to five, I went to St Andrew's Kindergarten where I met many of the kids that thirteen years later I would be graduating from school with. I don't remember any of it except for a continued love of the colour purple. In 2011 I started primary education at Ararat 800 Primary Wchool where I developed a passion for Chinese, art and especially maths. I remember getting really excited when I could add to ten before anyone else and when I could do the twelve times table in my head. During primary school, I attended Scouting at the Ararat Scout Club as a Cub (which is where they put you if you're too young to be a scout) which involved some poorly stitched badges and an old copy of the Jungle Book.





A big part of my younger childhood was spent around farms; I can still remember visiting my dad's paddock where he'd keep cattle, pigs, horses and yabbies. He'd was quite passionate about horses, growing up on a farm himself my dad had gotten himself the nickname "the horse whisperer". Both my sisters have inherited this passion for equine, me not so much. It was however enjoyable riding one of my dad's ponies, her name was Surprise and she lived till she was nearly forty. He had yabbies in the dam where he'd raise them to eat. I remember getting scared that the yabbies would pinch me and I wouldn't want to touch them. At the age of seven my dad would teach my sisters and me how to shoot by using an old clothes dryer as target practice. He would also let us sit in the tray of his ute while he would hunt for rabbits. Even before my Pa retired I remember watching him herd sheep on the farm he worked on; seeing him drive along in a four-wheeler while his sheepdogs ran alongside, with Rupert (he was a blind sheepdog) on the back of the fourwheeler. There were occasions when we had pet sheep in the back yard gifted to us by Pa and I found nothing odd about this.

When I was four months old I had rolled off the kitchen table, before my mum could act I had hit my head on the floor and off to the hospital we went. Due to this, I had to travel by ambulance to the Royal Children's Hospital. They found out that I had developed subdural hematoma which is bleeding around the brain. This led to several years of repeated tests to my parent's annoyance with drives back and forth to Melbourne. I don't remember most of this but I do remember playing with the giant touch screen in the main area.

I would like to thank my mum for raising me and my sisters all on her own and even though it was hard never giving up. I want to thank my grandparents Noel and Marilyn for teaching me that words should not change how you feel about yourself by saying the most insane stuff every chance they got. And I'd also like to thank my uncle for always being there for me when I needed someone to talk to. Seeing everyone who has helped me I really want to do something to help others, so in the future, I want to attend university to become a doctor.

Some advice I could give to younger students is don't let what others think or say about you affect how you live your life because, at the end of the day, it only matters about how you see yourself.



FROM YOUR HOUSE LEADER

Hello Marian Community,

We are well and truly in the midst of Term 2. Just a quick reminder that a full winter uniform now needs to be worn.

Schools are very busy places and this often leads to students becoming overwhelmed at times, or to feel certain levels of anxiety. This week I've been reading a few articles in relation to this and came across some interesting information from Psychologist Andrew Fuller. He has an excellent website full of free resources for teachers, students and parents:

Students and anxiety:

The biggest barrier for most students to doing well at school is not their attitude, intelligence or motivation; it is their levels of anxiety. Recent research by Resilient Youth Australia (www.resilientyouth.org.au) has found that 25% of girls and 21% of boys feel anxious and under strain. These levels shoot up to 68% of girls and 36% of boys by Year 12.

Mistakes are opportunities for growth. Shame causes low motivation. It is better, some kids reason, to opt out than to endure humiliation. Classrooms should be more about questions and less about answers. Many people say they learn more from their failures than their successes.

This type of thinking is important to remember as we all navigate the challenges of school work and school life.

Our sense of belonging and attachment is the foundation stone of resilience. Schools are an essential element of belonging. I think students at Marian College are very supportive of each other, but feel this support could be applied more often to support each other more in their school work, not just general everyday life problems and issues.

Anxiety is a sign of an overloaded brain. It is toxic to creativity and memory. Learning the signs of stress and knowing what to do to come back to a state of relaxed focus is a skill everyone needs. When I read this, I can see how important it is to have balance. To switch off from social media and technology at times. Exercise more. Eat Healthy. GET ENOUGH SLEEP. Try and find time in your days to practice this.


