It was wonderful to welcome all students back onsite last Tuesday and to spend some time preparing them to reconnect with friends, teachers and the learning onsite once again. There will be important learnings to take from this time. Yet, despite the difficulties and added stress, there were some positives from this experience. Overwhelmingly, students identified enjoying time with family as one of the key positives to emerge from remote learning. We also know some students struggled during this time. Many started well but as the weeks passed without knowing exactly when schools would re-open, motivation diminished.

Transition Week is about consolidating the learning off-site, getting back on track if that is required, taking ownership of your learning, and making a difference in the weeks remaining in this term and beyond. We understand this has been a very difficult time for our young people but most students have shown they

are more resilient than they could have imagined. They should be commended for their efforts, and encouraged once again to think about the long term goals. Teachers are there to support their journey forward.

VCAL VIRTUAL TOUR POMONAL ESTATE

On Friday, 5th of June the VCAL students participated in a virtual tour with Central Grampians Local Learning and Employment Network at the amazing Pomonal Estate. We had the opportunity to have a tour with some amazing people and some cute doggies, Griffin and Archie. The tour went for an hour and we learnt some amazing techniques to use in a vineyard. Pep and Adam Atchison took us on the tour and showed us around their property.

They have been in this industry for about three years and before that were in other industries and employment.

The class started off the tour in the vineyard where they grow all their grape vines and they showed us how to properly prune the bushes in winter to stop the vines from dying from frost. We then went and had a look in their orchard which is all fenced high to keep out all pests and animals that could harm the growing process of the trees. They are currently growing apple and pear trees that they will be able to make their own cider with but the trees take up to 5 years to fully grow and produce enough fruit to be able to make their cider.

Pep told us how they have to prune the trees a certain way to let enough sunlight in to let the fruit grow properly. Once

they had finished showing us the orchard we went and had a look at the cellar door. They headed inside and they showed us the interior and explained to us how many they are allowed to have in their facility due to COVID-19. We also got to check out their new renovations outside and then went on into the kitchen to have a look.

After this, Adam took us to his microbrewery and showed us the process he takes to make his beer. Adam explained to us how putting one ingredient can change the whole taste and how long you have an ingredient in the mixture for as it can change the bitterness of it.

We all loved being able to participate in the virtual tour and enjoyed being able to see Pomonal Estate and all the job opportunities available to us. Many of us asked Pep and Adam questions about how they are adapting to the way they do things due to COVID-19. One thing for sure is that if Mr Dean was here he would have been over the moon to be joining us in the tour for he was the one who loved vineyards.

Have you considered vocational education and training (VET)?

Have you considered pursuing vocational education after school?

Research shows that 4/5 parents would prefer their child to go to university after school over vocational education and that many young people and parents don't understand the benefits of vocational education and training (e.g., TAFE, apprenticeships, traineeships).

2017 Australian research suggests that:

- 9 out of the 10 top occupations predicted to have the most jobs growth are in vocational training areas.
- The median full-time income for a vocational education graduate is \$56,000 vs \$54,000 for someone with a bachelor degree.
- Nearly eight in 10 vocational education graduates have a job soon after training, vs about seven in 10 university graduates; and
- More than nine in 10 trade apprentices have jobs after finishing training.
