

This evening will begin in the Brigidine Centre at 6.30 and conclude with a session on distribution of the iPads, the camp, and routines to assist students settle smoothly into secondary school. This Monday our Year 12 students travel to Cave Hill Creek for three days of Retreat. This is an important time for students to understand their important role within our college and the values they hold in the palm of their hands. We wish them every success in this time of reflection and growth.

'Off and Away'

By now you would have heard of the 'Off and Away' policy implemented across the college. I sincerely thank the very high number of parents who provided feedback and valuable comments on our survey last year. All students and staff were surveyed at the same time.



Based on the feedback and our observations of phone use in the college, our decision has been to implement a conservative approach rather than full ban on phones all day. From the beginning of 2020, students are not permitted to bring a phone or listen to music during any structured learning time: classes, Teacher Advisor times, assemblies, class meetings, retreats

or camps during activities, or any other scheduled learning periods. It is important that students provide a lock to secure their phones during the day. The college cannot take responsibility for unsecured equipment. Students will be permitted to use phones at lunch and morning tea only. **Please see the full policy enclosed within this Newsletter for further details.**

In very rare circumstances, permission will be granted by the Principal for medical monitoring. If you have any concerns please contact the college to discuss any individual circumstances directly with the Principal. We know this will be an adjustment for many students but working together I am sure we can greatly improve learning engagement across the college and support the wellbeing of all students.





SCHOOL PROCEDURES FOR USE OF MOBILE PHONE, EARBUDS, EAR PHONES AND SMART WATCHES CURRENT AS AT 2020.

Background.

Marian College, like all schools, grapples with the use of mobile phones and other forms of technology as educational learning tools and as a distraction to learning.

With the current State Government's Legislative position, Marian College has taken this opportunity to gather feedback from our three major stakeholders: Parents, Students and Staff.

As you would be aware when such broad feedback is gathered you will never create procedures that will in fact keep everybody happy. However our response is in keeping with the feedback of those surveyed. We ask for family support in this.

Procedures for the use of mobile phones, earphones, earbuds and smart watches for Marian College Ararat.

"Off and Away".

For the purpose of this document, the term Mobile Phone includes but is not exclusive to Apple and Smart Watches, Ear buds and Ear phones.

1. The school discourages students from bringing Mobile Phones to school.
 - a. We are, however, aware that phones will come to school for a variety of reasons.
2. If a student chooses to bring their Mobile Phone to school, it MUST remain in their locker and be turned off during all class times. This includes, but is not limited to Teacher Advisor time, House time, Wellbeing, Assemblies (group or whole school) liturgies and other ceremonies, incursions and guest speakers, exams, study and tutorials.
 - a. Exceptions to the above can be made at the discretion of the classroom teacher for specific application, with prior approval from Head of Learning & Teaching.
 - i. An example of exceptions (but not limited to); class based learning activities that involve using 'apps' that students have on their phones.
 - b. Failure to charge an Ipad or computer at the appropriate time is not a legitimate reason for permission to use a phone in class.
 - c. The school takes **NO** responsibility for damaged, lost or misplaced phones if the locker is not locked.
3. In cases of extraordinary circumstances, Parents may apply for an exemption for their child directly to the Principal. An example of an extraordinary circumstance includes (but is not limited to) students with medical diagnoses reliant on the use of phone applications for health monitoring and assessment.

A breach of these procedures will result in the Mobile Phone being taken by the schools representative and stored at the front office for the remainder of the day.

If the breach becomes a regular occurrence a school representative will make contact home.

BUSHFIRE PREPAREDNESS INFORMATION

As we enter the bushfire season for another year it is important that the guidelines regarding school arrangements for CODE RED days, Total Fire Ban days and bushfire alerts are clearly articulated to all parents. These are as follows:

1. **No** school buses will run on any days that are declared CODE RED to Marian College. This includes the Halls Gap, Pomonal, Moyston, Amphitheatre, Elmhurst, Buangor, Beaufort, Concongella, Stawell, Navarre, Landsborough, Maroona and Willaura routes. All of these buses run through areas that are on the **At Risk Register**, and as such, are unable to transport students on CODE RED days because of the high potential of bush fires.
2. On CODE RED days, parents are asked to ensure students who are remaining at home because their bus is not running are **never** left at home unattended or in the care of older children.
3. **Marian College has not been identified as being at high fire risk**, and as such it will remain **OPEN** on a CODE RED day unless it is directly threatened by fire.
4. If a fire starts during the day that affects a bus route home, the College will be notified by the bus Coordinators at either Stawell or Ararat College. It may be possible that students are not permitted to travel home on the bus in such a situation. Parents will be notified if this occurs, and students will be cared for at school until transportation home can be arranged.
5. While our school has not been identified as being at high fire risk, we do plan offsite activities – such as camps and field trips – during the fire season. If such activities are considered to be at risk from fire, or occur on a Total Fire Ban day-they will be rescheduled or cancelled.
6. If your child is old enough, talk to them about bushfires and your family's bushfire survival plan – particularly if you are planning day trips or holidays to fire-prone areas.

Please feel free to contact the College if you require further advice or information.

Secondary School Vaccinations in 2020

The Secondary School Vaccine Program offers free vaccines to Year 7 and 10 students. These vaccines provide protection against:

- Diphtheria, tetanus and whooping cough – one dose for Year 7 students
- Human Papillomavirus (HPV) – two doses for Year 7 students
- Meningococcal – one dose for Year 10 students

Parents/guardians of Year 7 and 10 students should look out for the vaccine consent card booklet coming home from school with your child. You need to read the information, complete and return the card regardless of whether your child is being vaccinated at school.

The Ararat Rural City immunisation service may contact you about the Secondary School Vaccine Program. Schools are authorised to provide basic parent/guardian contact details to local councils for this purpose. Contact the school by 21 February 2020 if you do not want your contact details given to the Ararat Rural City immunisation service.

To learn more about the Secondary School Vaccine Program, the vaccines, the diseases they protect against, or how you can prepare your child for vaccination, go to: immunehero.health.vic.gov.au or call the Maternal and Child Health Centre on 5355 0224.

Year 11 or 12 students who have missed their Meningococcal vaccine in Year 10 still have an opportunity to be vaccinated under the program. Please contact the school office to obtain a consent card.

- ◇ Responsibilities in relation to the school provided iPad; And
- ◇ The Parent Access Module.

You will meet your child's TA teacher, who will demonstrate how to access the Parent Access Module – an informative online portal that you use to access vital information on your child's progress and assessment.

This evening is a vital initial step in opening up clear communication lines between you and your child's TA teacher, remembering that the TA teacher is the person you need to initially contact with any concerns you have in relation to your child.

The evening is for parents only. Supper will be provided. It is anticipated the evening will conclude by 8.00pm. We look forward to welcoming you.



Dental Van Visit

The Victorian Mobile Health Services Dental Van is visiting Marian College for the week starting 16-20 March, 2020.

All students that participate will receive dental education in a fun and safe environment, a dental examination and preventative treatment if required, and an oral health report.

The Victorian Mobile Health Services operate under the Medicare Child Dental Benefits Schedule (CDBS), therefore there is no out of pocket expense for eligible families. If your child is not eligible under the Child Dental Benefits Schedule, the Dental van can still offer a free dental examination if you wish to participate in the program.

A consent form will be given to your child/ren during their TA for you to sign and return to the school by Wednesday 19th February if you would like your child to participate in the program.

2020 Fees

Marian College endeavours to keep its fees affordable and as such we have limited our fee increase in 2020 to only 2%, which is close to the annual increase in the Consumer Price Index (CPI). The new fees will be as follows:

4 th Student	\$860	\$880

Depending on the year level there are also a number of other charges relating to electronic books/resources plus the \$100 per student iPad cost for Years 7-10. In respect of the iPad, parents will own the iPad at the end of Year 10.

As in previous years where parents/guardians are entitled to claim the State Government Camps Sports and Excursion Fund (CSEF) we will credit this against your fee account.


